MINISTRY of SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENUERSHIP Demands for Grants

After careful consideration of the demands and interests of the people and the government, we have prepared a list of proposed initiatives and a tentative budget for our ministry for the Fiscal Year 2023-24. This year, we anticipate exponential growth in startups and an increase in the number of unicorns. We have reviewed and revised existing programs and developed new, high-quality programs to prepare for this year. The following are the proposed initiatives and a brief overview of each:

- 1. <u>Skill India Programme</u>: Promotion of skill development under various programs.
- 2. <u>National Council for Vocational Education and Training (NCVET)</u>: Mandatory Vocational training for college students from 3rd year and optional from 9th class of High School.
- 3. <u>Indian Institute of Entrepreneurship (IIE)</u>: A national level apex body for entrepreneurship development through training, research, etc.
- 4. <u>National Institute of Entrepreneurship and Small Business Development (NIESBUD)</u>: An organisation promoting entrepreneurship by training, consultancy, research and publications.
- 5. <u>National Instructional Media Institute (NIMI)</u>: An institute with objective to prepare instructional material for the use of the trainees and trainers, developing e-Content to facilitate new age learners and enhance its reach to masses.
- 6. <u>Labour Pact</u>: Providing free manpower and interns to small start-ups free of cost for up to a month for a year.
- 7. Pradhan Mantri Kausha<u>l Vikas Yojana</u>:
 - 7.1 Development of Skills: Providing free vocational training to ages 15-45 belonging to SC, ST, Minorities and other backward sections of the society and non-literates and neo-literates via NGOs.
 - 7.2 Promotion of Apprenticeship and Shadowing: Promoting apprenticeship and shadowing to spark interest in various fields.
 - 7.3 National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme:..National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme: Promotion of Apprenticeship scheme has been rationalized and renamed as National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme from 2022-23 onwards
 - 7.4 Development of Entrepreneurship: Creating a favourable ecosystem for entrepreneurship development through training, advocacy, etc.
 - 7.5 Strengthening of Infrastructure for Institutional Training
 - 7.6 Strengthening of Skill Institutions

- 7.7 Skill Acquisition and Knowledge Awareness for Livelihood Promotion (SANKALP): The World Bank-assisted project aims to strengthen institutional mechanisms at both the national and state levels, build a pool of high-quality trainers and assessors, create convergence among all skill training activities at the state level, and establish a robust monitoring and evaluation system for skill training programs.
- 7.8 Skill Strengthening for Industrial Value Enhancements
- 8. Pradhan Mantri Start-up Fund (PMSF): Providing capital to exponentially growing start-ups and start-ups with nation's interest.
- 9. Media Coverage: Making short documentaries on rapidly growing startups and extraordinary skilled persons under Skill India Programme, to spark interest of youth in entrepreneurship and importance of skillsets.
